




SGUL wireless connecting guide for Windows 10

Make sure you are running the latest driver version for your particular network card as some connection problems may arise from an outdated device driver.


1. In the bottom right hand corner of your screen, click on the **wireless** network icon.




2. From the list of available networks, click on **eduroam**, then press **Connect**.



3. In the **username** field, type in your full **SGUL** email and your **SGUL** password in the **password** field. Then click **OK**.
 - e.g. **username@sgul.ac.uk** or **username@hscs.sgul.ac.uk**



4. Accept the certificate by pressing **Connect**. You should now automatically connect to **eduroam** whenever you are in range of an access point.



To remove eduroam settings from your device.


If you need to remove the eduroam settings from your device, for example if you have changed your SGUL password and need to change it on the laptop, or if you are troubleshooting then follow this guide.

Please note you do not need to do this if you have just completed the guide on the previous page.


1. In the bottom right hand corner of your screen, click on the **wireless** network icon.



2. Click on **Network settings**.



3. Click on **Manage known networks**.



4. From the list of known networks, click on **eduroam** then press on the **Forget** option.
